Biography

EMIR NERADIN – PROSECUTOR OF THE PROSECUTOR'S OFFICE OF BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA

Emir Neradin was born in 1975. He graduated from Sarajevo Faculty of Law in 2000 and passed the bar exam in May 2003.

He worked as an intern at Sarajevo Municipal Court II in the period between 2001 and 2003.

In the period from 2003 to 2004, he worked as an expert associate in the Independent Judicial Commission (IJC). After that, he worked as an expert associate in the Commission on Human Rights within the Constitutional Court of Bosnia and Herzegovina from 2004 to 2005 and, from 2005 to 2007, he worked as an expert associate and a senior expert associate at the Registry Office of the Court of Bosnia and Herzegovina - Section I for War Crimes and Section II for Organised Crime, Economic Crime and Corruption.

In the period between 2007 and 2013, he served as a judge at Sarajevo Municipal Court - Criminal Division.

In November 2013, he was appointed Prosecutor of the Prosecutor's Office of Bosnia and Herzegovina by a decision of the High Judicial and Prosecutorial Council of Bosnia and Herzegovina.

In 2003, in the technical journal *Legal Advisor*, issue numbers 1 and 7-8, issued by the Centre for Promotion of Civil Society, Sarajevo, he published two his works entitled '*Naknada nematerijalne štete u pravu Federacije Bosne i Hercegovine*' (Non-Pecuniary Damages in the Law of the Federation of Bosnia and Herzegovina) and '*Etažno vlasništvo*' (Condominium Ownership).

He and Dalida Burzić co-authored their work entitled '*Praktična primjena posebnih istražnih radnji u Bosni i Hercegovini*' (Practical Application of Special Investigative Actions in Bosnia and Herzegovina), which was published within an OSCE Mission project in Skopje, FYR Macedonia, in 2013.
