Biography

MILORAD BARAŠIN – PROSECUTOR OF THE PROSECUTOR’S OFFICE OF BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA

Prosecutor Milorad Barašin was born in Srbac, Srbac municipality, Bosnia and Herzegovina, on 15 January 1961. He graduated from Banja Luka Faculty of Law in 1985.

Mr Barašin did his internship at Srbac Basic Court and passed the bar exam in Sarajevo in 1987. After passing the bar exam, he spent two years at the Basic Court working as an expert associate, after that he was appointed judge at the same court and worked on criminal cases and, in early 1992, he was appointed Main Public Prosecutor in Srbac where he worked until the implementation of the judicial reform in Bosnia and Herzegovina.

Prosecutor Milorad Barašin was the first among judicial staff in Bosnia and Herzegovina who went from one Entity to work in another and, on 21 July 2003, he started working as Chief Cantonal Prosecutor in Canton X (Livno Canton) where he worked until 1 March 2007 when he was elected Prosecutor of the Prosecutor’s Office of Bosnia and Herzegovina and immediately assigned to Team I of the Special Department for War Crimes.

From 15 November 2007, he assumed the position of Deputy Chief Prosecutor of the Prosecutor’s Office of Bosnia and Herzegovina after being appointed to this function by the HJPC at the session held on 15 November 2007. He published several papers in the field of justice and the most recent one in which Prosecutor Barašin was a co-author is the paper titled ‘*Komandna odgovornost*’ (Command Responsibility). Prosecutor Barašin has been working in judicial institutions for 22 years.
